Super Neighborhood 17 – Eldridge/West Oaks Minutes from the meeting of January 11, 2023, 7:00 PM

- **I. Call to Order** President, Jeff Baker called the meeting to order. A quorum was established. Turnout was above average.
- **Public Safety** Officer Tim Whitaker provided a rundown of crimes in SN-17 for the month of December as compared to November. Violent crime was down. Robberies, burglaries, and thefts (shoplifting and auto thefts) were up. There were 33 arrests in SN-17, eight of which were DWIs. (See crime stats below)

III. Guest Speaker, Constable Ted Heap, Harris County Precinct 5

Precinct 5 covers approximately 1.3 million residents and spans over 300 square mile. It covers all of west Harris County, half of which is inside the Houston city limits.

The city and county work well together. Heap stated, "we consider our office an extension of the Houston Police Department." **Precinct 5 dispatch is 281 463-6666.** It was recommended that the dispatch number be used as the primary contact on monitored alarm systems.

The Precinct 5 office has grown in size (450 sworn deputies) and capability as west Harris County has grown. Visibility and response time are the greatest deterrents to crime, and the patrol division remains the precinct's largest. Additional divisions include K-9, motorcycle, environmental crime, animal cruelty, cyber, hot spots, and civil divisions.

Precinct 5 offers training courses geared to teens and adults alike e.g., new driver training, and campus safety programs. The community relations line is (832) 927-6793, where you can discuss your group's training needs.

There is an upcoming *Civilian Response to Active Shooter Events* class for adults, free of charge, on *January 24, 2023, from 6:00 – 8:30 pm @ Radack Community Center, 18650 Clay Rd.* Civilian Response to Active Shooters – constablepct5 to register, class size is limited.

IV. Community Leaders

District F: Office of Councilwoman Tiffany Thomas (Na'Shon Edwards)

Alief Neighborhood Center held its grand opening on Saturday, January 14. The new multipurpose facility at Bellaire Blvd and Kirkwood in southwest Houston offers a recreation center/park, a public library, a senior center, and a Women, Infant, and Child Clinic. The 38-acre renovated park features a public pool, playground, skatepark, baseball diamond, soccer fields, walking paths, and tennis and basketball courts.

- District G: Office of Councilwoman Mary Nan Huffman (James Rains)
- 1. A contract is expected in the near future to begin work on **Phase II of the Kirkwood Paving and Drainage Project** Briar Forest to Westheimer.
- 2. Fifty **Flock cameras are now in operation** throughout District G. Placement of the cameras was chosen by HPD in areas deemed high crime.
- 3. Construction on the **Army Corps of Engineers Office** (Hwy 6) has been halted. It is expected that the job will be re-bid, timing unknown.


