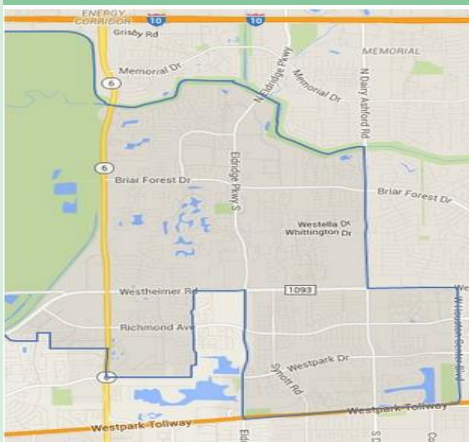

"BRIAR VILLAGE"



Briar Village (also known as Briar Park Community Improvement Association) is a beautiful, tree-lined neighborhood located at the northeast corner of Highway 6 and Westheimer. It is just a few minutes from Westheimer Parkway, essentially across the street from George Bush Park. The neighborhood contains 768 homes and the majority of the homes were built in the early seventies. Many Briar Village residents are original home owners.

The community has an updated clubhouse, a pool and tennis courts; there is also an updated playground, designed for children of varying ages. Briar Village also has private security and a Citizens Patrol. Though the neighborhood is located in the fourth largest city in the country, it has a "small town" feel to it - where friendly residents wave to one another as they walk their dogs or get their morning/evening exercise.

Briar Village offers numerous “neighborhood” clubs and activities for its residents. There is a Fourth of July parade, an Easter Egg Hunt and a “Spring Fling.” While the parade and Easter egg hunt are free for residents, the Spring Fling is an event at the pool that offers barbecue, games and fun! The proceeds of the Spring Fling benefit the Briar Village swim team, the “Briar Flyers.” The neighborhood clubs include a scrapbooking club, a Mom’s club, a garden club, and a club for residents 50 years and older. There is also a monthly newsletter.

There is a canal or channel that separates the “east” side of the neighborhood from the “west” side, and neighborhood children often fish there during the summer. The channel helped keep the homes in Briar Village from flooding during Hurricane Harvey. ~Diane Guilleman
